# What is the 12-Year Program (TYP)?

The *TYP* is a statewide, multimodal, and fiscally constrained list of transportation improvement projects spanning a *12-year period* that serves as Pennsylvania's official mid-range planning tool.








# Transportation Funding

- Transportation projects listed in the TYP use a combination of **federal, state, and local/other funding**.
- Available amounts are based on **legislation, actual and anticipated budgets, and historical trends**.
- **Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)**
  - \$2.34 billion for highway programs in PA
  - \$1.76 billion for bridge replacements and repairs in PA
  - **\$X.X billion for Transit**
- **BIL Grant Program Opportunities**
  - Electric Vehicles, Buses and Ferries
  - Safety and Resilience
  - Public Transportation and Freight Rail
  - Roads, Bridges and Major Projects
  - Airports, Ports and Waterways



# Transportation Funding

The 2025-2036 12-Year Program provides over **\$88 billion** for all modes of transportation.



### HOW CAN PENNSYLVANIA INCREASE TRANSPORTATION FUNDING?

We asked you to "suggest how Pennsylvania can increase transportation funding." 1,089 survey respondents provided feedback, many including multiple ideas, for a total of 1,337 comments.

THE MOST SUGGESTED FUNDING SOURCE WAS:

- 1 Reallocation of Money
- 2 Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT)
- 3 Tolling

### WHAT ARE YOUR TRANSPORTATION ISSUES?

We asked you to map and describe your transportation issues, which generated 4,248 responses submitted statewide, with 127 of those concerns already being addressed by planned projects. Over 50% of issues submitted were roadway concerns, followed by pedestrian and bicycle issues at 25%.

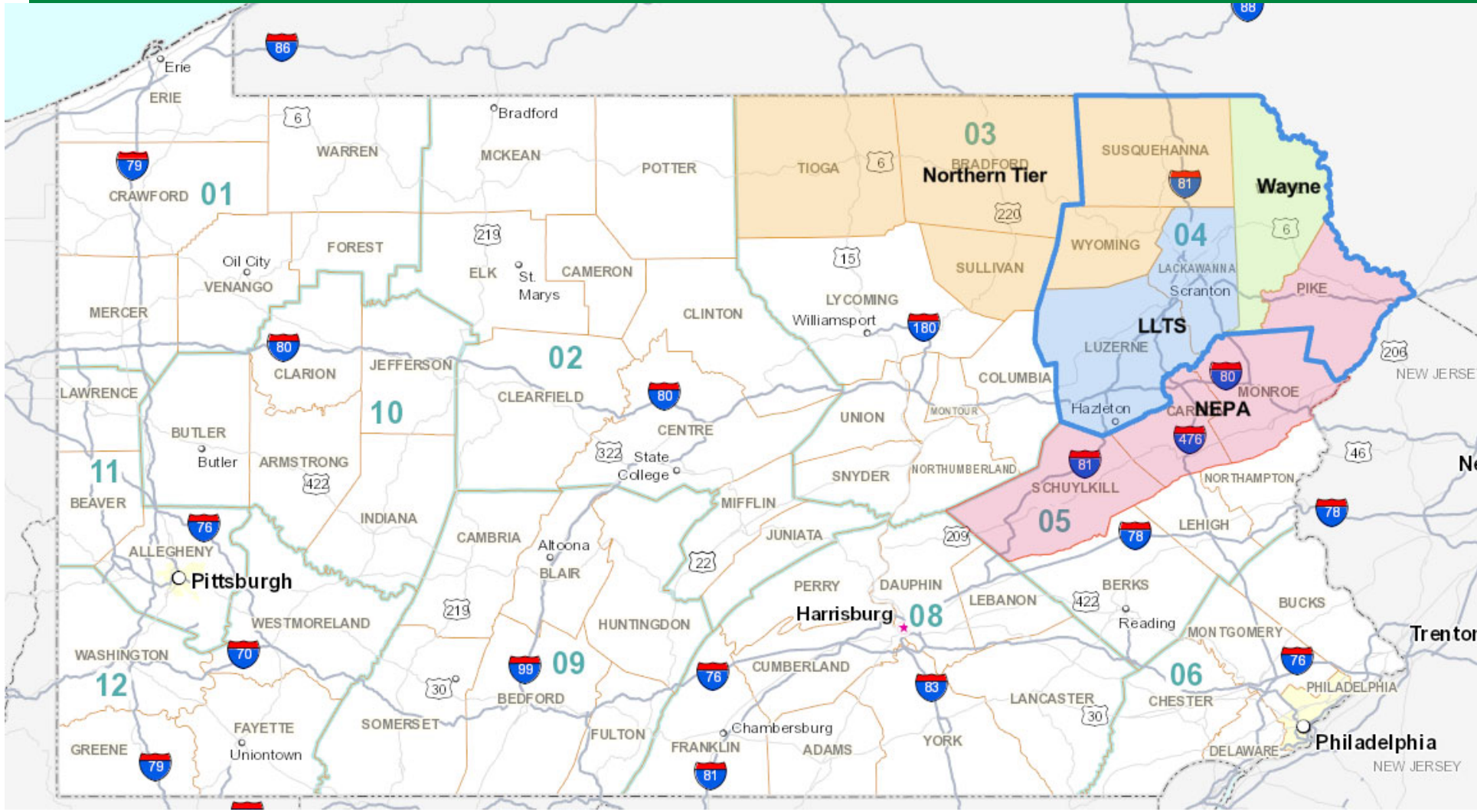

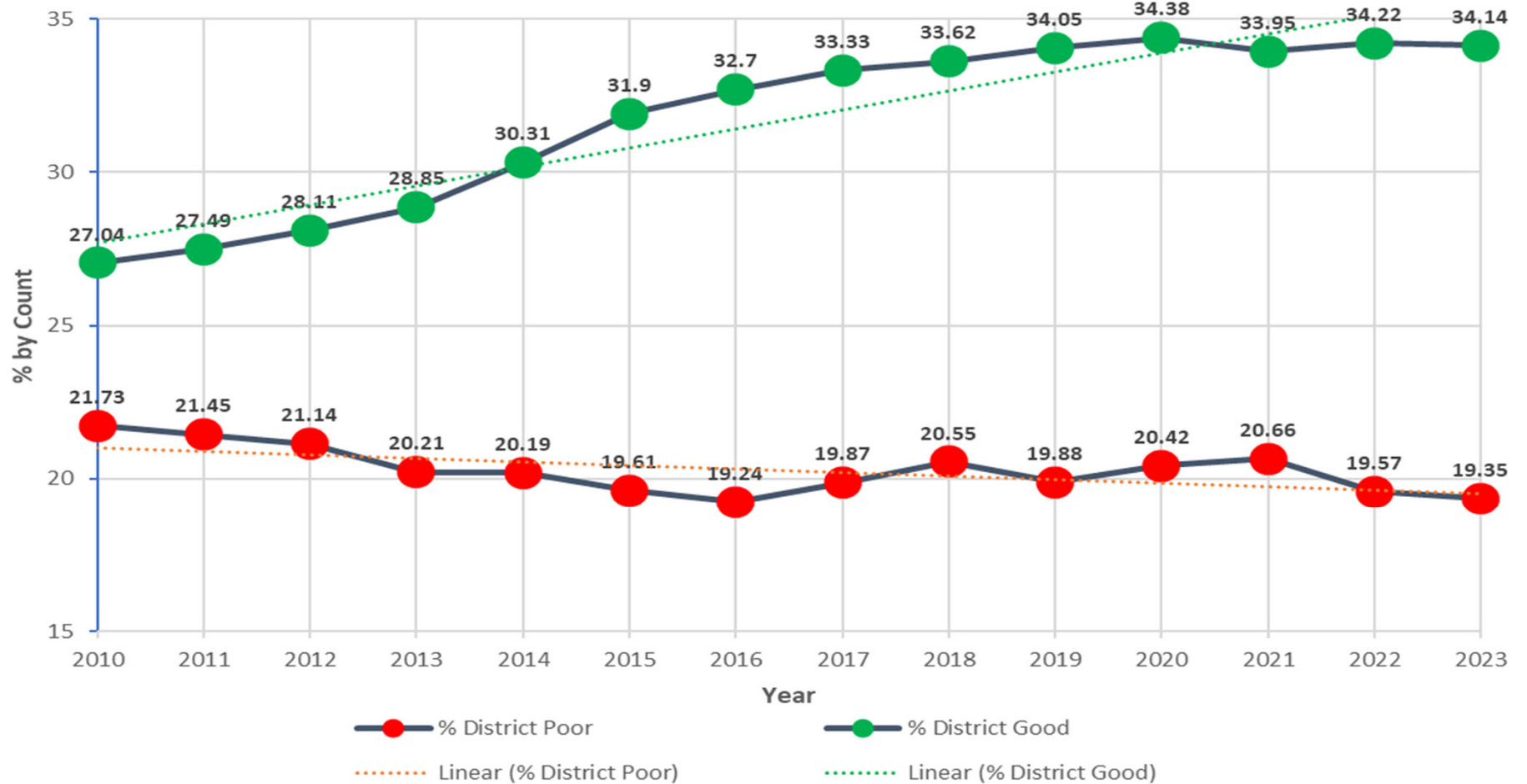

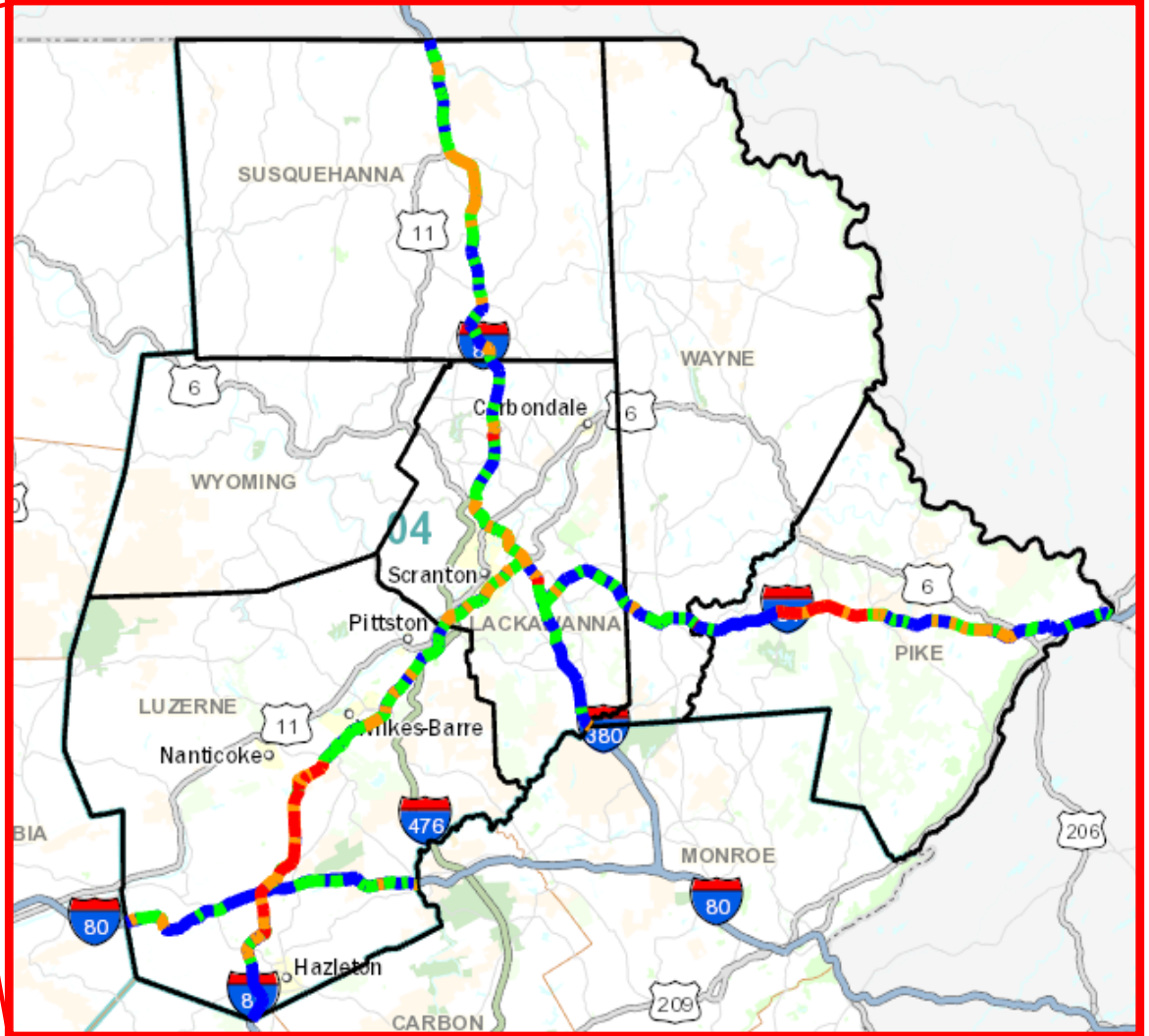

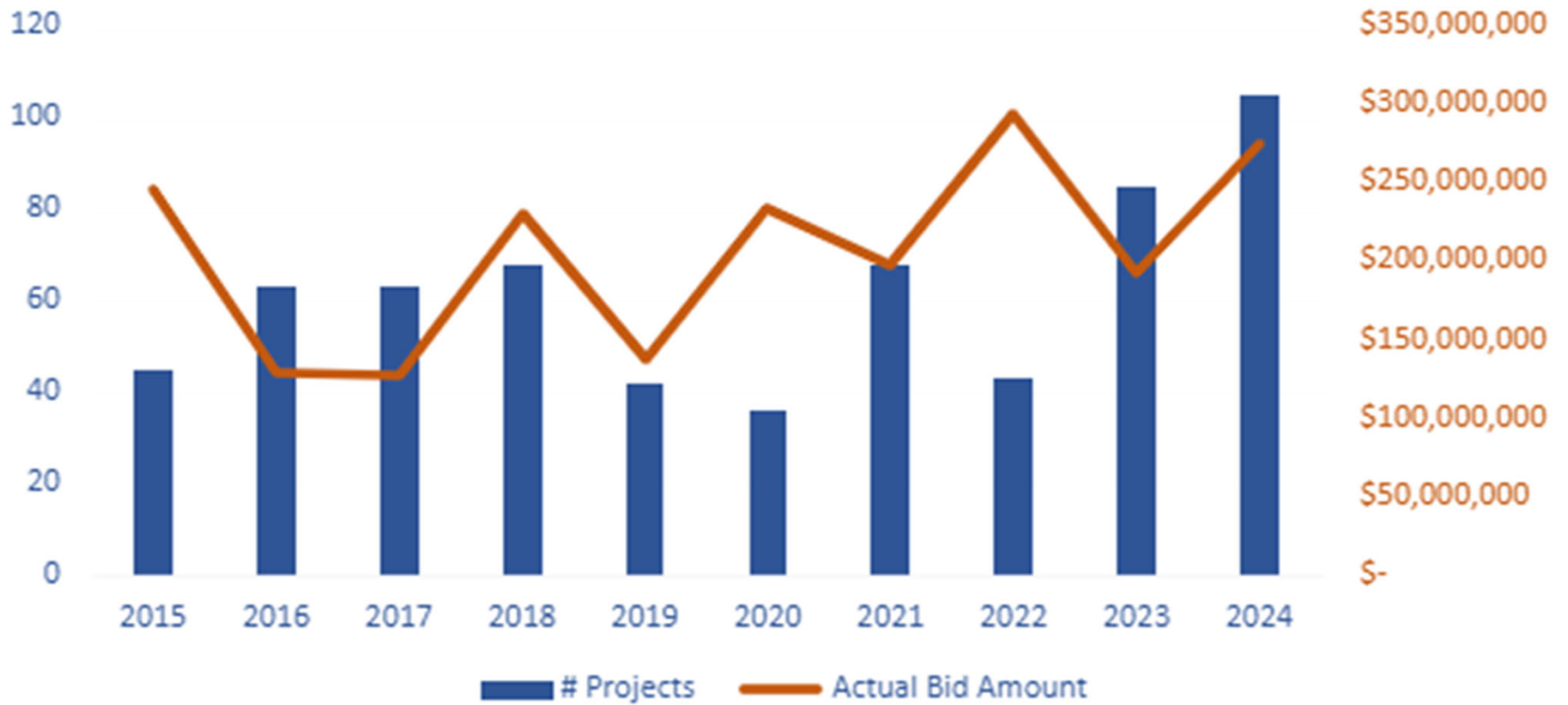

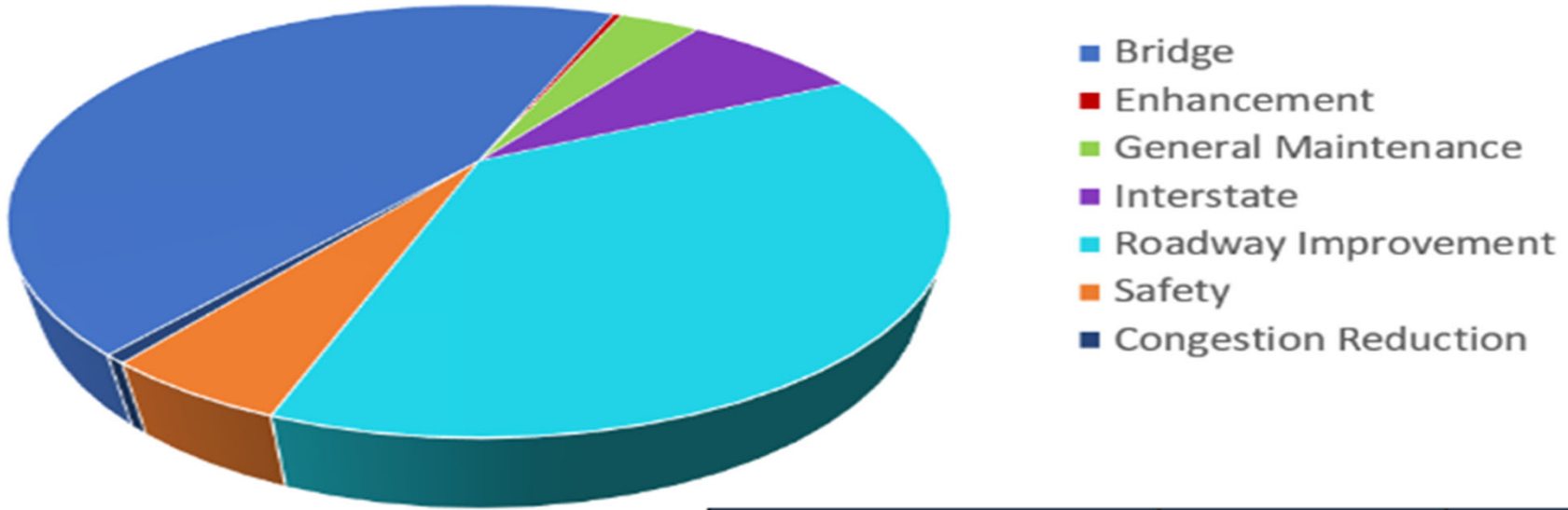

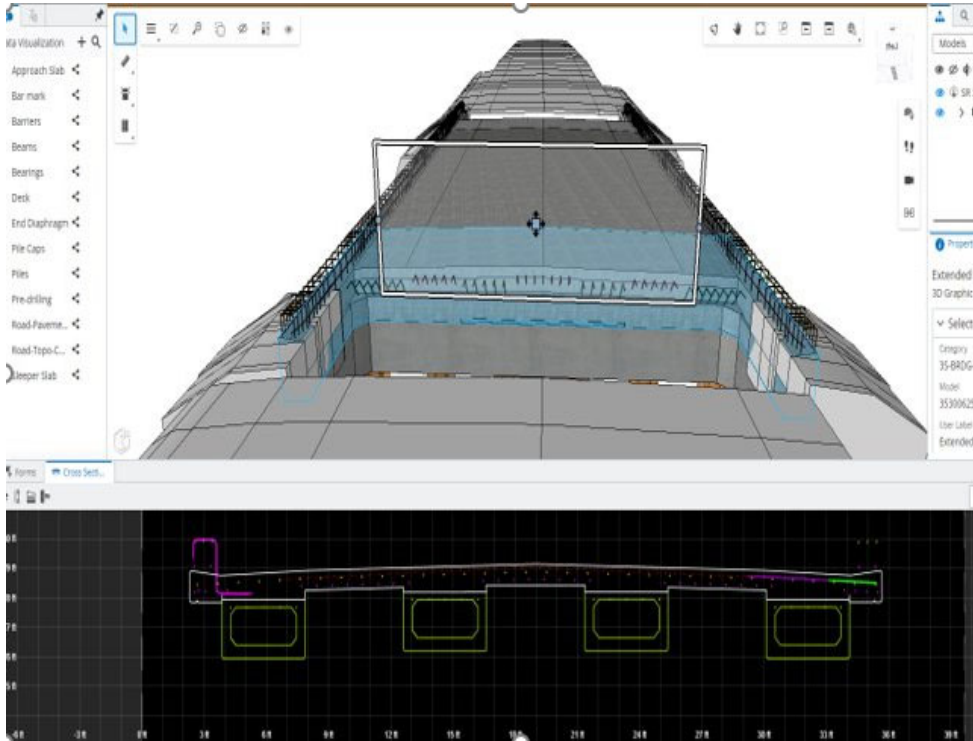

### Highway Occupancy Permits

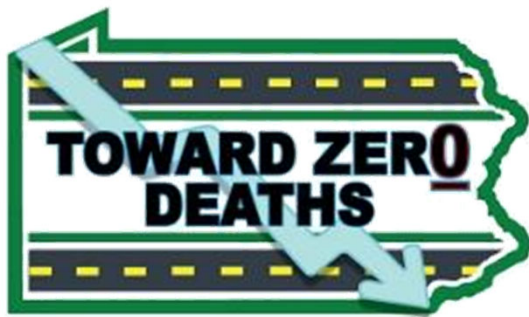
- 3,700 applications reviewed

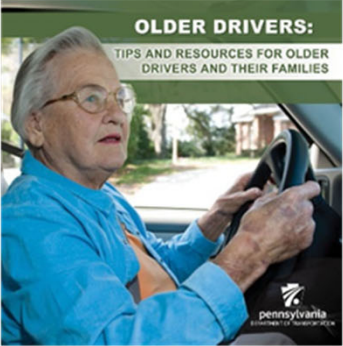
